'Heroes and Villains'.

This week we are finding out about the villainous couple 'Bonnie and Clyde'.

I have put some information sheets and a short video about who Bonnie and Clyde were on Itslearning, if you can't access Itslearning, ask an adult to email school and I'll email the files to them.

Bonnie and Clyde were young Americans who went on a crime spree during the 1930s. During that time in America many people were poor and there weren't many jobs. This time is called The Great Depression.

Slang words and phrases were as popular in the 1920s and 1930s as they are now! However they have changed over the years.

Can you find out the meaning of these slang words? They are also on a worksheet on Itslearning.

rhatz, soup job, beef, attaboy, let's blouse, bee's knees, phonus balonus, big cheese, scam, caper, swell, moll and sitting pretty'

What slang words or phrases do you know? e.g. Kip - sleep or nap, butty - sandwiches. Ask your family if they have any words.

Can you use some of the words and phrases from the 1920s to create an imaginary conversation between Bonnie and Clyde? Maybe they are planning a bank robbery or how they will escape from the police. There is an example on Itslearning. Can you read your conversation with someone at home - maybe you could try an American accent! If you can, film it and ask an adult to email it to the school or share it on Itslearning.

## Science - 'Habitats and Food Chains:

There is a powerpoint and some information on Itslearning about sorting and classifying vertebrates - don't worry if you can't get on these, they are an extra.

Last week you looked at what is a habitat, different examples and micro-habitats.
