Literacy

Prepositions

A **preposition** is a word that tells you **where** or **when** something is in relation to something else.

Examples of prepositions include words like after, before, on, under, inside and outside.

After walking for miles she rested on a hill.

In this sentence 'after' tells you when she rested and 'on' tells you where she rested.

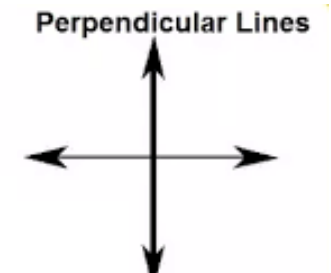
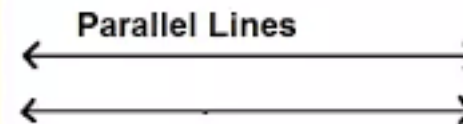
Maths

This week we are looking at Horizontal and Vertical lines. A horizontal line goes side to side. Like to horizon. A vertical line goes up and down like a tree. I have put a simple powerpoint on the website and Itslearning where you need to identify horizontal and vertical lines. There are some worksheets on there as well.

Once you understand horizontal and vertical it's time to move onto parallel and perpendicular lines.

Parallel lines are always the same distance apart for their entire length.

Perpendicular lines cross each other at right angle.
